



Peter Henson is a retired Police Inspector and has been a member of the Credit Union since its early days.

Prior to retirement from the police service he served for four years as a full time Federation Officer and Treasurer to Greater Manchester Police Federation and assisted officers and the force as an adviser on both discipline and equal opportunity matters.

He is currently the Honorary Treasurer for two police charities, firstly, the Police Treatment Centre based in Harrogate and Auchterarder, Scotland, which provides rest, recuperation and intensive physiotherapy to ill and injured police officers, and secondly, the St George's Police Trust which provides support to the children of police officers who have died or are so incapacitated they are unable to work.

He is also a member of the Greater Manchester Probation Trust Board, a role in which he has a responsibility for finance and holds a position on the Audit Committee.
