



John Yeomans served as an officer in Cheshire and Greater Manchester Police for 31 years, concluding his career in 2003 as Detective Inspector in the Headquarters Public Protection Unit.

John continues to work for Greater Manchester Police in a support staff role representing the Police at Child Protection case conferences around Greater Manchester.

He joined the Greater Manchester Police Credit Union on its inception in 1986, and showed an interest in the progress and development while also attending AGMs. John was asked to join the board as a director in 1992.

He became president of the Greater Manchester Police Credit Union in 1998 and played a formative role in its development and growth as it first became No1 Police Credit Union incorporating North Wales and Cheshire forces, and then later in the merge with Copperpot Credit Union .

On retirement in 2003, John stood down from the role of president but has remained an active member of the board; more recently taking on responsibility for Governance.

In 2006 John was asked to join a national steering group drawn together by ABCUL to develop a Code of Governance for the British Credit Union movement. This code was launched by ABCUL in November 2008 and now forms the framework for Governance of British Credit Unions.

When not involved in work with the Credit Union, John devotes considerable time to his local community being Chairman of a local park Friends Group. He is also an executive member of Stockport Greenspace Forum, member of his local Rotary Club and District Protection Officer for Rotary International, a role which is directly linked to his past and current police work experience.
